The Northern Territory Audit of Surgical Mortality (NTASM) is supported and managed by the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons (RACS) and funded by the Northern Territory Government.



All Northern Territory surgeons and hospitals participate in NTASM.



WHAT IS NTASM?



An audit of all surgically related deaths in the Northern Territory.



An important way to ensure that surgical care in the Northern Territory remains safe and improves.

WHAT ARE THE GOALS OF NTASM?



To inform and educate the Northern Territory surgeons.

To improve the quality of surgical practice in the Northern Territory.

To facilitate appropriate changes in surgical practice.

HOW DOES NTASM ACHIEVE ITS GOALS?



Data on the surgically related deaths are collected and analysed.





All Northern Territory surgeons receive feedback on their NTASM patients.

HOW SAFE IS SURGERY AND WHAT ARE THE RISKS?



NTASM data shows that most surgically related deaths occurred in elderly patients with underlying health problems. They were admitted as emergency patients with acute life-threatening conditions.



Their causes of death were often linked to their underlying health problems. Most surgically related deaths do not occur on the operating table.

HOW TO BEST MANAGE END-OF-LIFE CARE?



Good end-of-life care relies on good communication.

Before any surgery, ask for simple and clear information from your health professionals.
