Getting started in 2023

In 2023, the CPD program will return to a standard 12-month period from 1 January until 31 December 2023. Your CPD requirements are as follows.

To help proactively record your CPD activities on the go, the CPD App is a great resource to assist you in completing your CPD requirements this year.


The CPD App provides you with the ability to do the following in the palm of your hand:

RACS has established a pilot colonoscopy peer support program, the Renewal of Endoscopy Skills and Training (REST) Program. Overseen by endoscopists who have significant experience in endoscopy, the program is tailored to the individual needs to the endoscopist requiring support which could include peer review of audit data; onsite visit; clinical attachment to a peer or other professional development activity. The program is founded on the principle of collegiality, with the emphasis on patient safety and quality endoscopy.
