## **Definition of Relevant Deaths for WAASM**

Deaths that are relevant to WAASM are those that occur:

- (i) After a surgical procedure during the last admission regardless of length of stay, where the patient died during the admission.
- (ii) Within 30 days of a surgical procedure if the patient is discharged alive from hospital
- (iii) Whilst under the care of a surgeon, but where no operation was performed (non-operative deaths)

## **Scenarios**

- 1. Patient is admitted under surgeon or physician, has operation and dies during last admission regardless of length of stay.
- 2. Patient is admitted under surgeon or physician, has operation, is discharged alive, but dies within 30 days of operation (dies outside of hospital\*, or upon readmission to the same or different hospital).
- 3. Patient is admitted under a surgeon, does not have any operation and dies during the last admission regardless of length of stay.

<sup>\*</sup>These deaths may not be fully captured. WAASM relies on the treating surgeon to self-report the death when they become aware of it. WAASM's aim is to still audit such deaths if they are reported.
